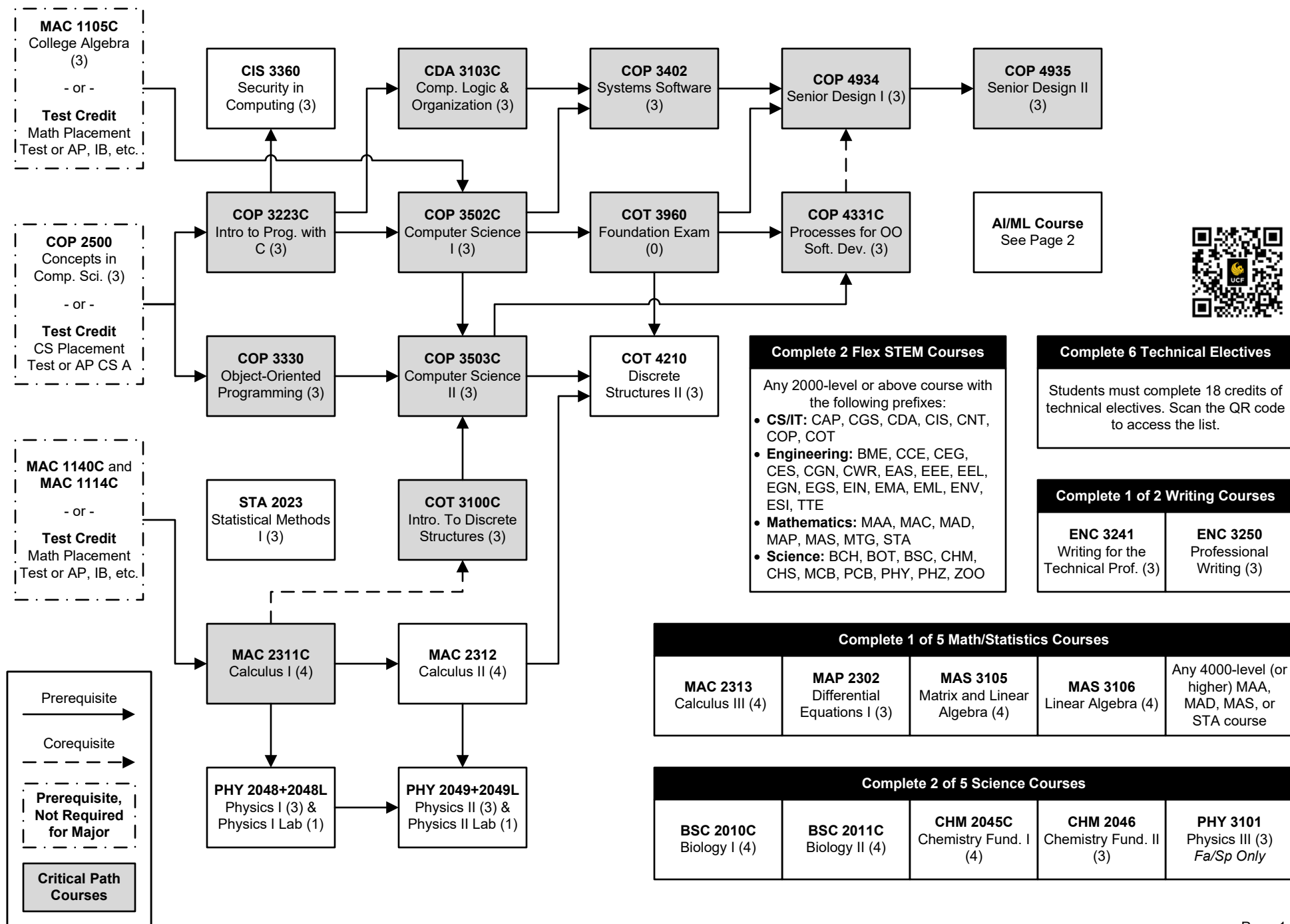
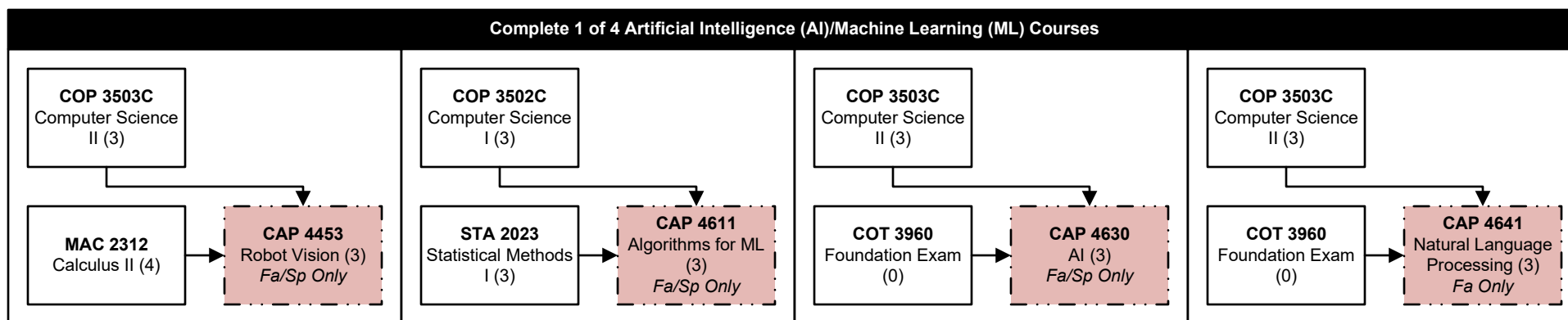


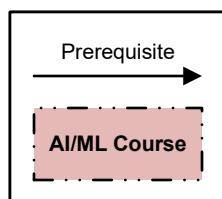
Computer Science Flowchart (Fall 2026 Catalog)

Grade Requirements

All courses require a "C" (2.0) or better.

Term Offerings

Unless otherwise noted, courses are offered year-round (Fall, Spring, and Summer). Courses may not be offered in all listed terms, or may be offered outside of regularly scheduled terms.

Course Requisite Updates

When requisites for a course change, they impact all students regardless of their catalog year.

Foundation Exam

All Computer Science majors must successfully complete the Foundation Exam (FE) within three semesters of passing COP 3502C with a "C" (2.0) or better. The FE is offered once per semester, with a maximum of three attempts. Skipping an FE offering after you have passed COP 3502C counts as one of the three attempts. Senior Design Sequencing Policy

The Senior Design sequence must be taken in consecutive semesters (Fall-Spring, Spring-Summer, or Summer-Fall), with the second course in the sequence being in your graduating term.
